The Rights and Responsibilities of Volunteers

Volunteers have the right to:

- Be treated with respect, consideration and courtesy at all times.
- Receive adequate induction and orientation to their tasks, including appropriate job training.
- Protection, insurance and personal safety when carrying out assigned tasks.
- Have concerns, complaints and grievances heard.
- Be reimbursed for prescribed out of pocket expenses incurred during approved activities.
- Say 'no'. Not to be coerced into participating in activities or taking responsibilities against your wishes.
- Confidentiality of personal information.
- Suitable work tasks with consideration for personal preferences, life experiences and employment background.
- Some guidance and direction to be supported in work duties and to receive appropriate feedback regarding their performance.
- Be treated as a team member and to be heard; able to contribute ideas, skills and knowledge.
- Have a holiday.
- Withdraw support and resign from position.

Volunteers have the responsibility to:

- Work within the philosophies, policies and procedures of the organisation.
- Be loyal, committed and maintain confidentiality.
- Accept direction and supervision.
- Identify and report any potential health and safety hazards.
- Speak up regarding important issues and concerns.
- Be willing to learn new things and undertake training.
- Work the agreed hours and be dependable and reliable.

- Recognise personal and external limitations.
- Be accountable and accept evaluation and feedback.
- Carry out the specific tasks defined in your job description
- Let your organisation know as soon as possible, if you intend to stop volunteering
- Value and support other team members
- Let your organisation know as soon as possible if you are going to be absent.
